

## WE HAD A VERY SUCCESSFUL APPLEFEST!!!



**November 14** - The November 14<sup>th</sup> program at the HPSUT will be given by Board Member, Robert Holden. The meeting will be held at the Upper Branch of the Cape May Library Refreshments at 7:00 pm with this timely and interesting program to follow. Guests are always welcome.

The program will focus on the **100**<sup>th</sup> **anniversary of America's Entry into The Great War** in Europe. Although this occurred in April, 1917, this program will be given for both the anniversary and a commemoration of Veteran's Day.

The program will begin with a discussion (handouts will be reviewed) about the beginning of World War One in Europe <u>before</u> America's entry and then move on to discussing how the United States stayed out of the war as long as they did, (due to an intense and widespread Peace Movement and President Wilson's 1916 re-election promises.) and just why President Wilson believed the time had come in April, 1917 to commit American Forces to this "Great War" on European soil.

Mr. Holden will bring an assortment of films focusing on World War One (only clips will be seen; not entire films):

The Great War (recent 2017 PBS special)

All Quiet on the Western Front (the original Academy Award winning B&W 1930 version of the film)
