• The township recently replaced the moss covered and badly worn roof on the Friendship School.


(For our Spanish speaking members: "moss, no mas!")

In mid-April, J. P. Hand acted as tour guide and showed the John Wesley Gandy House to another John Gandy and family. The group totaled about eleven people which included three generations of Gandys. They were accompanied by their family friends, Terry and Louise Van Gilder. The Van Gilders and John Gandy are all Cumberland County natives with Cape May County roots. (It should be noted here that Terry and Louise are members of HPSUT.)

John Gandy and family now reside in the state of Maine where John operates schooner trip excursions. Interestingly, John found, and then donated the A. J. MEERWALD (the official tall ship of New Jersey) to the non-profit Bayshore Center at Bivalve, that was, at the time, known as the Delaware Bay Schooner Project. The volunteer group restored the oyster boat, and continues to maintain the vessel which offers both pleasure and educational sailing trips.


Thanks and appreciation to Jamie for stepping in to conduct the tour at short notice due to the illness of this writer.
