HPSUT PROGRAMS - Spring 2023

Tuesday, April 11, 2023, 7 pm
Camp Wissahickon in Cape May 1917

Dr. R. E. Heinly, retired Director of Cape May MAC and knowledgeable historian, will discuss Camp Wissahickon, the often-forgotten World War 1 Naval encampment once at the foot of the Garden State Parkway; and about a Naval Base that was constructed on a Cape May amusement park.

Tuesday, May 9, 2023, 7 pm
Native American Folkways

John Ryan, Operating Officer of Historic Cold Spring Village, and excellent speaker will speak the customs, traditions, and origin stories of the Lenapi as the original residents of Cape May County.

Tuesday, June 13, 2023, 7 pm
Saints and Sinners: New Jersey Women in the Civil War

American women participated in the Civil War in many roles, some far outside the usual perception of women of that era. We hear almost nothing about these women in our traditional history classes.

Presenter **Pary Tell**, is the Treasurer of the League of the Societies of New Jersey and chairs the Lower Township NJ Historic Preservation Commission as well as the Cape History Coalition.

In this presentation, learn about New Jersey women and others, the Saints and Sinners, who rallied for abolition, supported the Union cause and assumed non-traditional roles in an effort to keep the Republic together...or not.
